Covid 19 Attendance Guidance

We thought it would be useful to remind you of the current Government guidlines on school attendance and Covid 19.

- Pupils who have symptoms of Covid 19 should isolate and get a PCR test.
- Pupils who have had a positive LFT test should isolate and get a PCR test.
- Pupils who are a close contact of someone who
 has tested positive do not need to self-isolate.
 They should get a PCR test and should only
 isolate if they test positive. If they test
 negative, they must return to school.

Neighbourhood Matters

The Police have a new system to interact with its communities and we are hoping that you could share the below with your parents in newsletters etc.

The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Jones, said: "We are delighted to launch Neighborhood Matters as a key part of our Local Policing and Community Charter. The new messaging service will help us to work more closely with the public, build strong community relationships and both reduce and prevent crime.

"Intelligence received from our communities is vital in preventing and detecting crime and anti-social behaviour. Neighbourhood Matters will be another mechanism that people can use to pass on information and concerns, speak directly to local teams and keep up-to-date with policing in their area. By working together to share information we can make a real difference."

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.





